What is Involved?

- □ **Diversity**: The inclusion of different types of people, such as people of different races or cultures.
- **Equity**: Just and fair inclusion into a society, including all racial & ethnic groups, in which all can participate, prosper, and reach their full potential.
- ☐ Inclusion: The ability to belong and contribute while being true to one's whole self and not having to give up cultural or personals ways of being or assimilate. It is belonging.
- □ Race: A socially constructed concept that is fluid and changeable that places individuals into categories based on appearances that are ascribed with cultural characteristics.
- ☐ Ethnicity: Social groups that have a common national or cultural tradition.



 - Marketing, Community Engagement

Who Is Responsible

The checklist is organized by areas of library service identified in the Wisconsin Public Library Standards. Each section provides a straightforward checklist that can be answered with Yes, No, In Progress, or Not Applicable. Use the Scoring Rubric to score each topic/section. See How to Use the Inclusive Services Assessment and Guide for examples.



Governance
